- It should become natural for children to leave their reading logs in the red box labelled *Reading Logs.*



Assessment and Parent Interviews

Your child's progress will be regularly evaluated throughout the year, using both formal and informal assessments. Teachers will administer summative, nationally recognised tests in Reading and Maths to monitor progress, alongside ongoing teacher assessments.

For Writing, teachers will assess work based on National Curriculum criteria.

During Parent-Teacher Interviews, teachers will share your child's progress and achievement. These interviews will be held on:

Homework in Year 3

Daily reading should take place every day (10 – 20 mins). Please keep hearing your child read and continue to sign and date the reading diary. Reading books should be in school every day for reading opportunities with an adult. Children are able to change their books on a daily basis when in school.

Children can access *Doodle Maths* at home.

Once a week, children will receive an English and Maths based homework. Homework will be sent out on Mondays and be returned on the Friday.

Spellings will be sent home weekly.

Please support your child to find a suitable time and day to complete homework and ready to hand in on time.




<u>Maths</u>

•We teach Maths daily using *WhiteRose* as our scheme. Children learn a variety of daily uses with Maths, including time, money, adding and subtracting.

•Once the children have completed their work in their workbooks, they are able to take a challenge sheet to confirm and test their abilities on the given subject.

•Children are also able to grab needed equipment and tools to aid their learning.

•Doodle Maths is accessible at school and at home.



English

- We teach English and Spelling using the *Ready, Steady, Write* scheme.
- Daily Guided Reading is also in place daily, either in a group or a class setting.
- Presentation is an important skill to have and at Foxes Piece we want the work done with high quality and presentation. Thus, we have handwriting daily after lunch using Kinetic Letters as our scheme.
- We try our best to help all students and meet their needs. We also challenge and support each child.







READING

- Please read with your child(ren) every day.
- We assess children's reading to ensure they are at the correct level.
- The more opportunity the children get to read, the more they can build a love towards it.
- The children are encouraged to grab a reading book from the reading corner or from the Key Stage 2 library.
